This 50 point course comprises three core subjects of the Master of Learning Intervention Disability specialisation, and one elective:

- Promoting Positive Learning
- Oral Language, Literacy and Learning
- Using Data to Build Pathways.

Ideal for educators hoping to better understand the learning needs of children and young people with disabilities, you'll explore learning interventions designed to foster inclusion and promote positive behaviour and learning.
