What will the research involve?

Participants will attend two workshops (90-120 mins each), bringing together different education stakeholders to discuss their perceptions of, and responses to, post-truth conditions. This will be a supportive forum where you can work collaboratively with others to unpack the complex issues relating to post-truth and collaboratively consider effective responses.

All participants will be compensated with a \$50 gift voucher for attendance at each workshop.

When will the workshops occur?

The workshops will occur in late-June and early-July 2021, to coincide with Victorian school holidays and the University non-teaching period.
